# School construction happening in your neighborhood this fall

## What to expect this Fall at Stevenson:

Construction on the new Stevenson campus will begin in September 2017 and will continue through June 2018. Demolition of the former Stevenson pod should be complete by fall, followed by the installation of the foundation of the new school building. The school will be complete in June, with the MUR completed in Fall 2018.

Work is planned for weekdays, from 7 a.m.- 7 p.m. At this time, weekend work is not planned, but could occur near construction deadlines. There will be truck traffic coming and going on San Pierre doing dirt offhaul in the fall and transporting heavy equipment and delivering steel this winter.

Dust may occur, and the District will follow procedures and best practices to reduce as much as possible any potential disruptions. The equipment used on the site and dust control measures we employ comply with the Bay Area Air Quality Management District standards. Additionally, there will be a green fabric screen applied to the fence to reduce the movement of dust across the site.
